You are based in Prince George with monthly travel to Tsay Keh Dene. You provide crisis intervention, referral and advocacy, individual outreach counselling, facilitating cultural connections, group facilitation, case management and other supportive services. You will develop and deliver culturally relevant, prevention, wellness and risk reduction activities to children and youth, including advocacy, individual counselling, workshops, groups and camps, and provide liaison, consultative and education services to other service providers and parents on behalf of Aboriginal clients.
